## Planning for **Spring Gala** at the Library

*This year's Spring Gala will be held on Saturday, May 18th.*

The Friends of the Library are gearing up for their main fundraiser of the year. During his year's Spring Gala on Saturday, May 18, they will hold their annual sales of books, plants, and "junque jewels" at the library from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Children's Program Director, Bonnie Angulas, will also man a lemonade stand on the Town Green.

### **Books, Audiobooks and Movies – Coordinator, Bruce Schmidt**

Donated books may be dropped off at the library beginning April 16. Please do not leave books on the porch when the library is not open as rain can damage donations. (NOTE: library hours: Tues. & Thurs. 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.; Wed. noon to 8 p.m.; Fri. 2-6 p.m.; Sat. 10 a.m. -1 p.m. The library is closed on Sunday and Monday.) Please NO textbooks, magazines, encyclopedias, or computer books that are more than three years old. Hardcover and paperback fiction, nonfiction, history, autobiography, biography, self-help, cookbooks, travel, coffee table books, and children's books are all welcome. We will accept movies on DVD but no VHS and audiobooks on CD but no cassettes please.

Most book prices will be: \$2 for hardcover, \$1 for paperback, and \$.25 for children's books.

Volunteers will be needed to help on Friday and Saturday. There is a sign up sheet at the library if you would be willing to help for an hour or two:

- Friday, May 17, 5 p.m. - moving books from an off site location in town to the library.
- Saturday, May 18, 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. - help with set up, sales, and after sale cleanup that will include boxing up left over books.

### **Plants – Co-coordinators, Sally Hogan & Dorothy Ledner**

Perennials including hosta, bleeding heart, lungwort, peony, thistle, and bee balm sold well last year. It appears Mont Vernon gardens have more than enough day lilies and iris. Small shrubs are welcome. Rhubarb, and herbs in pretty containers attract buyers. Please NO house plants – they don't sell. Do you have a request for a certain plant or plants? Please add it to the list posted in the library foyer and every effort will be made to find those on the list.

Interested in Dorothy Ledner's heirloom tomatoes? She is expecting to have brandywine and amateur varieties available this year. She will also have heirloom broccoli for sale. ***These plants will be pre-sold, so if interested contact her at 672-0570.***

When you dig in your garden, please remember plants need to have labels with name of plant, height, color of bloom and when it blooms, and if it likes shade, part shade or sun. This helps buyers decide what works best for their gardens. (Do you need a pot or two? Pots will be available behind the library beginning the first week in May.)

Plant drop off behind the library may begin two weeks before the sale. It is a good idea to pot plants at least 10 days before the sale so they look their best on sale day. Plants that are dropped off will be watered as needed.

Most plant prices will be \$5, five plants for \$20. There will be some specially marked plants depending on size and variety.

A possible raffle or two with containers of herbs and annuals is under consideration.

Please note, there will not be any half price sales as the day winds down.

There is a sign up sheet at the library if you would be willing to help for an hour or two:

- Friday, May 17; 2-5 p.m. moving plants from back of library to front for the sale
- Saturday, May 18; 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. - help with the sale and then clean up.


### **Wonder how the proceeds will be used?**

### **Book Discussion Program**

Next up on the library’s book discussion program is a fiction selection: “The Art of Fielding: A Novel” by Chad Harbach. **The discussion will be held on Monday, May 6, at 9:30 a.m.** The book, published in 2011, was rated as one of the best books of the year by the NY Times, Wall Street Journal, The New Yorker, and National Public Radio. The story focuses on five characters on a small college campus whose lives are impacted following a disastrous throw by baseball star, Henry Skrimshander. Ambition, family, friendships, commitments, and love are some of the themes. Interested? Copies of the book are available at the library.

The group usually meets once a month and the meetings last an hour and a half to two hours. Participants take turns bringing a light refreshment. No attendance requirement – attend discussions that are of interest. The library purchases a copy of each selection that may be checked out by library patrons when the book is not reserved for the discussion. Program suitable for adults. 

Take away FLEX pass – one pass admits two adults
