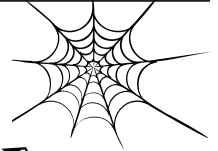
The Daland Memorial knitting and needlecraft group will meet for the monthly Friday gathering on October 14th from 7:30 to 9:00 pm.

**“Liberty is Our Motto!”:
Songs and Stories of the
Hutchinson Family Singers
Thursday, October 20, 7:30 pm,
Mont Vernon Congregational
Church**

The Friends of the Daland Memorial Library and the Mont Vernon Historical Society have received a grant from the New Hampshire Humanities Council to present the program, Liberty is our Motto. Originally from Milford, The Hutchinson Family Singers were America’s most popular musical entertainers for much of the mid-19th century. They achieved international fame with songs advancing social reform and political causes such as abolition, temperance, women’s suffrage, and the Lincoln presidential campaign of 1860. Chatauquan, musician and singer Steve Blunt (in character as John Hutchinson) tells the Hutchinsons’ story and shares their music with audiences of all ages. We have a local connection, too. The story goes that John Hutchinson used to hike up the hill from Milford on Sunday morning to hear a sweet little

songbird sing in the church choir and eventually made her his wife! This program is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be provided. Please mark your calendar for this interesting evening performance. The library does hold the 2-volume biography/history of the Hutchinson family if you are interested in learning more about them.

(POST MEETING CORRECTION: The new MFA passes will be available November 1.) Bonnie Angulas said a call has been put in to see about passes for the NH Children's Museum.

Trustees' Report – Cindy Raspiller, Chair, Town Library Trustees

1. Trustees' meeting - The Town Library Trustees (Cindy, Lise Fleurette & Jane King) recently met with the Daland Library Trustees (Mark Vaughn, Anne Dodd & Mary Collins). The Daland Trustees approved funds from the Daland Trust for the purchase of the new circulation software.
2. Master Plan - Cindy is the library representative to the Master Plan Committee. She suggested people attend the meeting scheduled for this coming Saturday from 5-8 p.m. at the Village School. This is an opportunity for community members to speak about what they would

like included in the Master Plan. (There are some things that will have to be included by law.) Cindy also said there will be an overview of the UNH survey completed by members of the community in the spring. The organizers are promising to stick to the plan the community decides on. (Some in the group remember the one put in place ten year's ago was pretty much disregarded.) There will be dinner available and babysitting. After dinner people will break into smaller groups and have a chance to brainstorm. The Master Plan under the direction of the Planning Board is being overseen by Wes Sonner.

Membership — no report this month

Library Director's Report – Bonnie Angulas reporting for Karen MacDonald

1. Halloween - A call in to Kelly Merryfield to see if she would once again like to order the treats to be passed out at the library on Halloween. If she is unable to do this Bonnie will take care of it. Volunteers that evening will be: Alice Corbett, Shirley Levesque, Sally Hogan. Halloween pumpkin carvings. Bonnie is once again going to invite community members to bring their carved pumpkins to the library to be displayed outside the building on Halloween. If possible contributors should put a small glass container such as a Mason jar in their pumpkin so the candles won't blow out. Last year 76 lighted pumpkins were on display. This gives families who live outside of town a chance to have a larger audience see their works of art. Pumpkins not collected afterwards will be taken by Bruce Schmidt to a local farm in town where pigs will enjoy them.

2. New circulation program - The new Apollo circulation software program will be up and running on October 3rd. The program will allow patrons to see what books are in the library, reserve titles and renew media material from their home computers. (Patrons will still have to go into the library to pick things up!)
3. Cleaning out the library - Bruce Schmidt, Earle Rich, Karen and Bonnie recently spent a few hours cleaning out the library's basement and attic. There was an amazing amount of old stuff that needed to be carted to the dump. Earle and Bruce loaded both their pick-up trucks and took everything away. A messy job well done. Special thanks to Bruce and Earle.
4. NHHC program - The NHHC program "Liberty Is Our Motto!" will be held on Thursday, October 20; at 7:30 p.m.; at the Mont Vernon Congregational Church. The program will be co-sponsored with the Mont Vernon Historical Society. Historical society members will bring drinks, cups and napkins. The Friends will provide pick-up food. Members offering to bake: Amy White, Jodi Williams, Lois Boericke, Bonnie Angulas and Shirley Levesque. Lois said the church will take care of setting up chairs in the Round Room. Helpers should plan to be at the church at 7 p.m.

Children's Program Director's Report – Bonnie Angulas

1. **Super Saturday** – October's program will feature the making of fairy houses out of pumpkins and other natural materials. A couple of samples are in the garden in front of the library.
2. **Lapsit and story time programs** – Both programs will begin next week. The story time programs are almost full
3. **Children's book groups** - The two children's book discussion groups

are underway. Mary Katherine McNamara is facilitating the 5th & 6th graders and Bonne is facilitating the 3rd & 4th graders. Both programs are off to a good start.

4. **Teen Times** – There will be four meetings this year. The first will be held in October and will be a “Glow Party.” There may also be a scavenger hunt.
5. **Lamson Farm Day** – Bonnie held a story walk featuring laminated pages from a book on barnyard animals. The pages posted on stakes were arranged along a rock wall at Lamson Farm. Thirty children signed the guest book. Publicity for the event included forms for people to join the Friends of the Library and a posted acknowledgement that the Friends provided the funding for the event.

A MOTION MADE, SECOND-ED AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED to pay the \$55 charge for materials for the story walk. Bonnie intends to use the story again this fall in one of the story time programs. Bonnie noted that Staples was wonderful in making the laminating as cost effective as possible. Both Bonnie and Amy noted that they each had community members ask if they had missed the barn dance this year. plant. The best way to get rid of it is to put it in a trash bag and put it in the dumpster at the dump. Burning bittersweet in the brush pile is a way to spread it.
