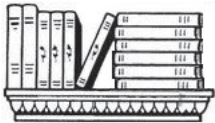
## e-Book news:

The Consortium has added a new format to the e-book collection. The \*Open EPUB\* format does not contain DRM (Digital Rights Management). This format will work on any type of e-book reader, tablet or smart phone that can currently use the Adobe EPUB titles. (No, it won't work on the Kindle!) Under CopyRight Protection, your rights to access this material still expire at the end of the loan period.

### **Membership – Mary Katherine McNamara reporting**

No change from last month – 52 paid members; 25 lifetime members

### **Trustees' Report – Karen MacDonald reporting**

The library has received a check from the Daland Trustees to cover the cost of the new computer and technical support.

The Amherst Garden Club has paid to renew the subscription of an organic gardening magazine.

Karen installed a new tile floor and soap dispenser in the bathroom. She plans to paint the walls white. Mary Katherine McNamara may help.

Jane King will be the trustees' representative at meetings with the cemetery trustees when discussing how the Carleton Land is to be divided. Papers have been found that explain how the land is to be divided between the town, library, and cemetery.

The Daland Library Trustees have asked the Town Library Trustees to decide when to move forward with a plan for a new library for the town. It has been suggested a committee be formed in 2013 to work on a plan to be presented to the town in 2014.

### **Library Director's Report – Karen MacDonald**

A check has been received from the Rotary Club for the Children's Summer Reading program. The money will be used for an owl program.

Town resident, Rich Masters, has recently become certified as a NH Fish and Wildlife Steward, and has offered to present a program on black bears. As quite a few have been sighted in and around Mont Vernon, this is timely. The program will be held at the library on Wed., July 18; at 7:30 p.m. Sign-up required as seating is limited. Program suitable for adults. Refreshments will be provided by Rich. There will be no charge. If there is enough interest, Rich will present a program on bobcats at a future time.

### **Children's Program Director's Report – Bonnie Angulas**

To kick-off the children's summer reading program, Bonnie did a presentation at the MVVS explaining the program to the school children. It was a success. To date, 170 children have signed up. Children may sign up into July.

Thank you to Bruce Schmidt for his assistance with the colorful bed that now sits on the library lawn showcasing the program.

A field trip to the planetarium in Concord is planned for tomorrow.

The tie-dye program is scheduled for Thursday.

NOTE: all activities are now filled.

Bonnie is delighted to have four teens who have signed up to help with the summer reading program.

The Rotary funded program, "Eyes on Owls", will be held on Thursday, July 12; at 1 p.m.; at the MVVS. The program will be geared for children with a live owl or two. Members of the community are welcome.

The raffle for the donated Kindle e-reader for teens is underway. 7th- 12th graders are eligible. Each book that they read means a raffle ticket may go into the jar. Teens are asked to write the name of the book and author and a short review about each book read.

Bruce Schmidt suggestion – to increase Friends of the Library membership, which help fund the summer reading program, perhaps members will be allowed to sign their children up early for summer reading program activities. This idea will be considered for next year. Bruce suggested it be included in the January newsletter when dues for the year are due.
