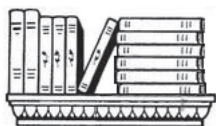

NOTE – there is a \$10 co-pay for EACH adult. Some special exhibits require a ticket with an additional charge. (Without the library pass, the ticket price is \$25 (\$23 for seniors.)

Passes may be checked out for one week. (Take away and FLEX passes are not returned.) Late returns will incur a \$5 fine. Please call the library at 673-7888, or stop by to reserve a pass. New Members Always Welcome!

Planning Meeting – January 6, 2014

The library's book discussion program will hold a planning meeting at the library on Monday, January 6, at 9:30 a.m., to put together the list of titles for 2014. A variety of selections including fiction, non-fiction, biography, autobiography, something local, and possibly poetry and/or short stories are expected to be on the list. New members are always welcome.

The group usually meets once a month and the meetings last an hour and a half to two hours. Participants take turns bringing a light refreshment. No attendance requirement – attend discussions that are of interest. The library purchases a copy of each selection that may be checked out by library patrons when the book is not reserved for the discussion. Multiple copies of the book are made available through inter-library loan. The program is suitable for adults and open to Mont Vernon residents at no charge. For bookkeeping purposes, non-residents wanting to borrow a book will need to join the library, annual fee is \$15. Questions call the library at 673-7888.

Looking for a Plant Sale Co-chair

While the library's Spring Gala Plant Sale isn't until May, a number of things need to be taken care of well before that day. Dorothy Ledner is willing to serve again as co-chair, but needs someone to share the responsibilities. (Sally Hogan is stepping down.) Here is the timeline that has worked well in the past. More complete notes may be reviewed under Plant Sale in the Spring Gala Notebook at the library. These are not etched in stone. . .if you have other ideas they would be most welcome.

3rd week in March: Dorothy would start vegetable plants from seed for the sale.

April: *Digging for Pots* info sheet on dividing and potting plants updated and passed out at the Town Cleanup Day in April.

April: Last year, we raffled a couple of planters with herbs, etc. If this is to be done again, they need to be put together in April so they fill out by Gala Day.

April/May: Requests for plant donations both by poster and in the newspapers starts in early April and goes into May.

Early May: Library garden cleanup, bark mulch purchased and spread. Organize volunteer diggers to go to those in town who would like to donate plants but need help.

First week in May: Start date for plants to be dropped off behind the library. Last year, Dorothy repotted and added potting soil if needed, then kept plants watered.

Week before the sale: Plants organized by kind, priced, watered if need be. Set-up in front of the library the day before the sale.

The plant sale brings in a considerable sum of money that benefits the library. Last year over \$1600 was made. ("NOTE: Next year, one quarter of the proceeds may be given to the Lamson Farm Commission to care for Joanne Griffin's Memorial Garden at Lamson Farm.) Please consider working with Dorothy on this worthwhile project. Questions and/or if interested contact either Dorothy at 672-0570, or the library.

Participants are invited to come to the library at noon with their lunch. There will be a short introduction including notes of interest about each film before it begins at about 12:30 p.m. The program is **FREE** and suitable for adults. It is sponsored and funded by the Friends of the Library.
