Peg Stacy (1922-2014)

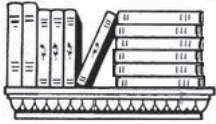
Long time Friend of the Library Member

News was received recently that long time Friend of the Library member and strong library supporter, Peg Stacy, passed away August 4 in Newburyport, MA after a period of declining health. Peg served as a town library trustee and also two two-year terms as co-president of the Friends of the Library. She was recognized along with Joe Conrad as a Friend of the Library Volunteer of the Year and rode in the Spring Gala Day parade in 2001. She served on three committees that developed formal proposals presented at town meetings that would have expanded our library. She worked on the first round of editing the library history, "Persistence & Progress: A History of the Daland Memorial Library 1892-1992", published in 2004. In 2006, she was a presenter in the library's Mont Vernon Wants to Know program. Her program, Preserving Family Memories, was well attended. She served as Grand Marshall of the Spring Gala Day parade in 2012. She was one of the original members of the library's morning book group that has met monthly since 2002. As her eyesight failed, she would listen to books on tape and participate in discussions. For many years, Peg and her husband Russell, who predeceased her in 2009, were instrumental in helping set up the annual book sale held on Spring Gala Day. They would appear very early in the morning on Gala Day to set up saw horses and long planks of wood for the boxes of books to be sold. Peg would then stay and help with the sale. Since her move from Mont Vernon in 2010, Peg's family would bring her up for Spring Gala Day and Lamson Farm Day. Her last visit to town was on Spring Gala Day 2014.

Peg and Russell donated to the town the gazebo that now sits in the Town Park. Benches, built by Carolyn Dorr-Rich, were funded by the Friends of the Library. Peg made her mark as a active volunteer and role model for our library and our town. She will be missed.

Peg was also an active and long time member of the Mont Vernon Historical Society. Because she loved anything chocolate, on Lamson Farm Day, Saturday, September 27, the historical society will offer free cups of hot chocolate in her memory. Anyone who wishes to stop by and share a memory or give a toast to Peg is invited to do so.



Morning Book Discussion Program

*New Members
Always Welcome!*

The next selection in the Daland Memorial Library's monthly morning book discussion program will be *Destiny of the Republic: A Tale of Madness, Medicine and the Murder of a President* by Candice Millard. This non-fiction selection relates the story of President James Garfield who overcame poverty to become a nine term congressman before becoming president. His presidency was short, 200 days, and controversial. He died eighty days after being shot by an assassin. The book was a New York Times bestseller. The author also wrote *River of Doubt* which received high praise and was a book discussion selection a few years ago. The discussion will be held on Sept 8 at 9:30 a.m. at the library. Copies of the book are now available at the library.

The group usually meets once a month and the meetings last an hour and a half to two hours. Participants take turns bringing a light refreshment. No attendance requirement – attend discussions that are of interest. The library purchases a copy of each selection that may be checked out by library patrons when the book is not reserved for the discussion. Multiple copies of the book are made available through inter-library loan. The program is suitable for adults and open to Mont Vernon residents at no charge. For bookkeeping purposes, non-residents wanting to borrow a book will need to join the library, annual fee is \$15. Questions call the library at 673-7888.

Children's Program Director's Report - JoAnn Kitchel

Summer Reading Program a big success.

- 218 children registered
- 2511 books were read
- 148 gift certificates to the Toadstool Book Shoppe were given to the children who reached their goal.
- Participants will have until the end of October to redeem their gift certificates
- While there was no formal teen program this summer, many came in to check out books.

- The glow fish were won by a new family in town.
- The five planned crafts and two scheduled performers were very popular and well attended.
- The robot will leave the library grounds when school starts.
- As part of the reading program, before school was out in June, children and teachers were invited to visit the library. The visits, billed as field trips, were scheduled over two days. Some children and teachers had not been in the library before.

Meeting notes (continued)

Fall activities include the following:

- THREE book group discussions for children to begin in October: 3rd and 4th graders; 5th and 6th graders; and NEW this year 7th and 8th graders. JoAnn will facilitate the discussions.
- Bruce suggested the list of books to be discussed by 7th and 8th graders be sent to the AMS. Bonnie intends to do this.
- REQUEST - \$300 to fund the three fall book groups to cover the cost of related craft projects and snacks.

Library Director's Report - Bonnie Angulas

Summer activities: The nine week summer adult raffle went very well. Raffle items included \$10 gift cards from the Mont Vernon General Store.

Friday's Sweet and Sour Hour was a success – especially on rainy days. Many who stopped in to check out books and movies for the weekend stayed to enjoy lemonade and a treat. As this activity was somewhat labor intensive for the staff, there may be a schedule adjustment next summer.

The Summer Beach Read for adults was also successful with 8-10 attending the first two discussions. The third and last meeting will be held this coming Wednesday.

NOTE: From this program, attendee Patty Hageman has offered to facilitate monthly evening book discussions beginning in the fall. *The Art Forger* by B. A. Shapiro will be discussed Wednesday, September 24, at 7 p.m. Books are now available at the library. Future discussions are expected to be held the last Wednesday of each month. Titles to be announced. The group is to be called **The Bibliophiles**.

The monthly morning book discussion group will next meet on Monday, September 8, at 9:30 a.m. and discuss *Destiny of the Republic* by Candace Millard. Copies of this book are also available at the library.

Fall activities: September is Get Your Library Card Month. Bonnie has set a goal to add 50 new card holders. She plans to let teachers from the MVVS know they qualify for free cards as they work in town.

Town Library Trustees' Report - Jane King

The trustees will be interviewing applicants to fill the open library assistant position. Kira Zotcavage returned to fill in this summer before returning to college and was a great help. The goal is to hire a tech savvy person. The job is ten hours a week which include Saturday mornings and Wednesday nights.

Two library building issues are being addressed. Following a heavy rain storm water came down the chimney indicating a possible roof leak. The trustees are also planning to request estimates for cutting down a couple of large tree limbs that are close to the roof. The Daland Trustees have been notified of these issues.

This would require some heavy equipment. Estimates will be sought. News received this month that Peg Stacy, long time Friend of the Library member and library supporter, passed away earlier this month. Alice Corbett asked for consideration of a way to remember Peg in the library.

Sally to revisit the wording for a plaque for the gazebo in the Town Park donated to the town by Russell and Peg Stacy. Earle to send her information on plaques.

The board position of treasurer is vacant. Jodi's work schedule has led to her decision to step down as treasurer. Thank you, Jodi.
