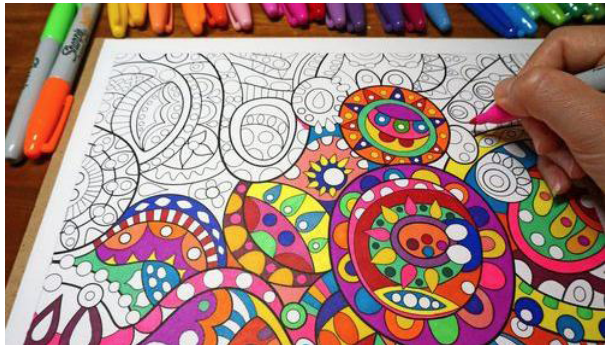

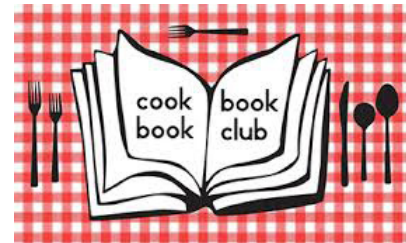
November Adult Craft Night: Coloring Books!

If you love cookbooks, cooking, and eating (and talking about cookbooks, cooking, and eating) this is the group for you! The Cookbook Club will choose one cookbook a

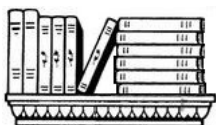

NOTE – there is a \$10 co-pay for EACH adult. Some special exhibits require a ticket with an additional charge. (Without the library pass, the ticket price is \$25, \$23 for seniors.)

Passes may be checked out for one week. (Take away and FLEX passes are not returned.) Late returns will incur a \$5 fine. Please call the library at 673-7888, or stop by to reserve a pass. The Fells passes are made possible by the generous donation of a library patron. Other passes are made possible through the fundraising efforts of the Friends of the Daland Memorial Library.

Only 4 people were able to attend the meeting on September 28, 2015. Without a quorum of officers, the meeting was cancelled. Therefore there are no minutes from September. Minutes from the August 2015 meeting were unanimously approved.

Correspondence: The Seacoast Science Center has a new program for libraries which allows two families per day to attend at 50% off the price of admission. The cost to the library for this program would be \$100 for a year. As this would be more popular in the summertime, it was decided to shelve it for now for consideration again in the spring.

Librarian's Report

The library has been "spookified" for Halloween by JoAnn Kitchel. It looks great and will certainly add to the holiday experience for everyone.

Programming: the last Adult Craft Night is next month. "Coloring for Adults" will offer a relaxing evening of coloring and doodling using some of the popular new coloring books geared toward adults. There are spaces for 16 people.

The Cookbook Club will be cooking from "The Pie And Pastry Bible" by Rose Levy Beranbaum for November. They enjoyed recipes from "One Pot Meals" by Martha Stewart on October 26.

We have had an increase in eBook and Audio book borrowing. The average per month jumped from 50 to 91.

Bonnie and JoAnn both attended the New England Library Association conference this month. There were many talks on digital libraries and promoting via social media. Bonnie was pleased to see that our library is right on the cutting edge in terms of social media presence and marketing.

Children's Librarian Report:

The three book clubs continue to be well attended and JoAnn is seeing an improvement in the discussions about the books read.

Storytime (both at the library and on Tuesdays with the Kindergarten at the Elementary School) are going well. JoAnn is working on starting a new Pajama-time Storytime for working parents next month. Kids will be practicing trick-or-treating this Thursday at the Mont Vernon General Store.

There will be a special triple-feature (for three age groups) Halloween Movie Night this Friday evening. Comfortable costumes are encouraged.

Trustee's Report

Budget has been submitted to the town Budget Committee. The format of the budget was different this year. For the first time, the town has asked to see all library expenditures as line items (even those covered by the Daland Trust and the FOTL) in order to provide a more complete picture of all that goes into the running of the library.

Newsletter

The Amherst Citizen will be moving to a monthly publication schedule so its deadlines for submissions have changed.

Old Business

The library gardens were cleaned up for the winter. Bushes and trees were pruned. It looks like there will be a need to separate some of the perennials in the spring and these can be included in the plant sale. We are looking for a new person to be in charge of the library gardens.

The Halloween treats have arrived! Special thank you to the Merrifield Family for selecting them. Janice and John Hubbard and Alice Corbett will be on hand Saturday night for trick or treating.

Lamson Farm Day: was a great success! A special thank you to the Friends of the Library who helped folks make 120 tie-dye bandanas. The location of the table and the weather made for an excellent day. We hope to do this again next year.
