# Mont Vernon Historical Society News

## ***Burial Grounds and Gravestones, April 14, 7 p.m. at the Mont Vernon Congregational Church.***

Curious about some of your ancestors? What might old forgotten stones and monuments in cemeteries tell you? Is the Internet the best source of information when looking into family histories? The Mont Vernon Historical Society and the Daland Memorial Library are co-hosting a program on genealogical research on Thursday, April 14, at 7 p.m., in the Round Room at the Mont Vernon Congregational Church. Richard Quintal will present the program, "Burial Grounds and Gravestones." The presentation will focus on how to find and what you will learn from old burial grounds, how to evaluate the death records you do find, and how to determine the accuracy of the information. Old gravestones dating from before the American Revolution can lead to valuable information. Rules of visiting cemeteries will also be covered. Richard will also spend time on the Green Lawn Cemetery in Mont Vernon.

Richard's interest in genealogy dates back to 1980 when he was leaving a business appointment in Chicopee, MA. He remembered being told by his family that a great-grandparent had once lived and maybe died there. His quest to find more information led to a visit to the local funeral home, an encounter with an angry records clerk, and the puzzle of a missing person piqued his interest in family history and genealogical research. The rest of this story will be told at the program.

Richard specializes in people and records from the sixteenth through the twentieth centuries. His research has led to visits to many physical repositories in the New England states, New York, and the provinces of Quebec and Prince Edward Island. He is a member of the New England Historical Genealogical Society and a present or former member of a number of other societies including the Association for Gravestone Studies

and the Mont Vernon (NH) Historical Society. He has been a resident of Mont Vernon for many years.

He has learned to take the information found on the Internet, which comprises about 10% of his research, to be generous but to be evaluated very cautiously. It's best to use trusted sites. Most of his research is conducted through visits to towns and cities and private libraries. He believes millions of documents will never appear on the Internet for several reasons: those holding them don't know or care for their research value and it's too costly to digitize in any significant volume.

The historical society's publication, "Lives Once Lived Here" (pub. 1998/99), is a great resource on the inhabitants of Mont Vernon's cemetery. The society is looking into updating the information and depending on cost, providing it for sale at a future date in paper and/or electronic form. A copy of the book will be available to look at on the night of the talk.

The Mont Vernon Historical Society is always interested in new members to support their activities which includes taking care of the museum located on the second floor of the Town Hall. Membership forms will be available at the program, or may be mailed to Mont Vernon Historical Society, Box 15, Mont Vernon, NH. Annual membership is \$10; lifetime is \$100. Please consider joining.

Beginning in May, the museum will be open on Spring Gala Day, Saturday May 21, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., then the second Saturday from 1-4 p.m. June through October. The Amherst and Milford historical society museums will also be open on these dates.

The program is free and open to all. Refreshments will be provided by members of both the Mont Vernon Historical Society and the Daland Memorial Library.

### ***Museum Passes at the Library***

Passes to four museums are currently available at the library to library patrons. Three museums are free and one has a small co-pay. Three are in NH and one is in Boston. New this year are passes to The Fells, established in 1891 in Newbury, NH, which became the summer home of Secretary of State John Milton Hay. ## Daland Memorial Library - Friends of the Library Meeting Minutes February 29, 2016

A motion was passed to approve the minutes of the last meeting.

### **Correspondence - Mary Katherine McNamara**

The FOTL received a thank you note from Holiday Toy Shop for donations made; a thank you note from Christine Dean for her staff Christmas present and a letter from former Library Director, Karen Brown.

The SEE Science Center museum pass expired in October 2015 and needs to be renewed. It is our most popular pass. Motion to renew the \$200 pass was approved.

An information letter from the New England Aquarium (in Boston) was received regarding their seasonal (September – June) pass which costs \$650/year. Families using this pass would receive a discounted admission charge of \$10 pp. A pass for March-June is also available for \$450. This pass is the most requested from our patrons. Discussion about purchasing this pass was tabled until June for September consideration. This will allow us to see how much funds are raised from the Spring Gala in May.

Jessica will check on the cost for a pass to the Boston Children's Museum and report that at the next FOTL meeting.

### **Treasurer's Report - Larry Yetter**

\$1575. has been collected from Membership YTD 2016.

\$45 was collected from donations/matching corporate gifts, YTD 2016.

The FOTL Bake Sale held during the presidential primary election collected \$912.12

### **February Report:**

A proposed budget for 2016 was submitted for review. Amounts allocated for the Summer Reading Program were amended and a line item for purchase of 3 pop-up tents was requested by Mary Katherine McNamara. These

changes were approved by vote and Larry will revise the budget to reflect them. [See page 4 of this newsletter.]

A motion to pass a resolution to complete the Certification for Fidelity Funds Business Accounts form for our account and that the President, Mary Katherine McNamara and the Treasurer, Larry Yetter, Jr., are authorized to act with full power and to bind the registered owner with respect to buying and selling and exchanging shares of Fidelity Mutual Funds held in the FOTL account was passed. Dana Laviano will also sign the form and have it notarized.

Jessica Hinckley will be added as a co-signee on the Capital One account.

A motion was passed to accept and complete the Organization Resolution for Citizen's Bank dated 02/04/2016 to authorize the President and Treasurer to open and manage accounts at Citizens Bank in the Name of the Friends of the Daland Memorial Library. The current officers are Mary Katherine McNamara, President and Larry Yetter, Jr., Treasurer.

In order to complete Form NP-1 for the State of New Hampshire, Secretary of State, a motion to propose changes to the FOTL bylaws was approved. These proposed changes will be sent in a separate email to the FOTL two weeks in advance of the next meeting date.

### **Librarian's Report - Bonnie Angulas**

The next Adult Craft Night will be March 17, at 6:30 PM on making Pysanky Eggs.

A Couch to 5k training program will start March 18 in anticipation of the Mont Vernon 5k. Runners Alley has contributed a gift card as an incentive gift.

The Cookbook Club met on February 29. There were 14 members in attendance for a very successful evening! Next month's selection is Ree Drummond's "The Pioneer Woman Cooks: Dinnertime."

The Library will be co-hosting an evening
