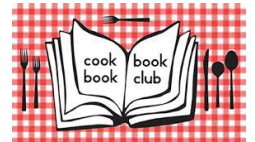


Take Time For Tea

MONT VERNON HISTORICAL SOCIETY NEWS

Museum will be OPEN on July 9 from 1-4 p.m.

The Mont Vernon Historical Society Museum will be open on Saturday, July 9, from 1-4 p.m. The museum is located on the second floor of the Town Hall. It opened twenty-six years ago in 1990. There is no charge to visit the museum.

The recently restored 1858 map of Hillsboro County is now back on the wall. See if you can find **Mount Vernon** as it was known at that time. The map had deteriorated over the years and was in need of attention. Thanks to the generosity of the Nipmugs chapter of The Questers in Amherst, and donations from individuals and the Mont Vernon Historical Society, the map looks as it once did.

Other exhibits of interest include the window and a bank of mail boxes from the post office that was located behind the general store from 1975-95. Lamson Farm and Grand Hotel memorabilia, two quite rare antique Nutter clocks, a row of eight David Dutton clocks, and a quilt made by the King's Daughters' organization that includes a square that is over 150 years old are also on display. One corner of the museum holds items of interest on the schools that have been in Mont Vernon over the years. The McCollom Building was the home for four different schools beginning with Appleton Academy (1852-1871) and ending with the Mont Village School (1947-1989). Some items and photos of the current Mont Vernon Village School are also included in this area. There is also a small library in the museum and a selection of historical society books, note cards, sweatshirts, and t-shirts for sale in the museum's store.

Who Was "Doc" Adams?

A note of historical interest: In a recent local newspaper, there was an AP article about Daniel Lucius "Doc" Adams who is now believed to be the Father of Baseball. He's recognized as the author of a recently authenticated set of documents, "Laws of Base Ball", that were sold at auction in April for \$3.26 million – the highest ever paid for baseball documents. He's credited with determining the distance of 90 feet between bases, each game having nine innings, and the number of players on the team to be nine. He played baseball for the New York Knickerbockers and was the game's first short stop. He was born in Mont Vernon (or Mount Vernon as it was known at the time), in 1819! A little research through the household book at the museum shows his family living in what are now the condos at the north end of Main Street where the Mont Vernon Inn once stood. After going to Amherst College and Yale University, he followed in his father's footsteps and went on to Harvard Medical School. He then practiced with his father in Mont Vernon before moving to Boston. He played baseball and practiced medicine at the same time. While the first attempt to have "Doc" Adams included in the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, NY missed the needed votes this year, another attempt will be made.

The museum will also be open the second Saturday, August through October from 1 to 4 p.m. Both the Amherst and Milford historical society museums will be open at the same time.

Consider supporting the museum by becoming a member. New members are always welcome! Annual dues are \$10; lifetime dues are \$100. (Dues to go up in 2017.) The teen programs have started. The first event had 9 attendees but the second has 15 registered so participation is growing.

New Business:

Morning Book Discussion Program

New Members
Always Welcome!

Two books will be the focus in the next Morning Book Discussion Program at the library: *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee & *The Mockingbird Next Door: Life With Harper Lee* by Marja Mills. The discussion will be held on Monday, August 1, at 10 a.m. Considered a classic of American literature, *To Kill a Mockingbird* was published in 1960 and became an immediate success. It went on to win the Pulitzer Prize and was also made into an award winning movie. *The Mockingbird Next Door: Life With Harper Lee*, published in 2014, is a biography of Harper Lee, known as Nelle, and her sister Alice. The author spent a number of years as their neighbor getting to know the sisters. The book has had some controversy.

The dates and list of books for the rest of the year are as follows:

August 1 – fiction & non-fiction – *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee & *The Mockingbird Next Door: Life With Harper Lee* by Marja Mills

September 12 (Labor Day is September 5) – non-fiction – *Victoria's Daughters* by Jerrold M. Packard

October 3 – fiction – *Brooklyn* by Colm Toibin

November 7 – fiction – *A Century of November: A Novel* by W.D. Wetherell

December 5 – non-fiction – *The Stories Behind the Best-loved Songs of Christmas* by Ace Collins

Alternatives in case a title is not available:

1. fiction – *A Man Called Ove* by Fredrik Backman
2. fiction – *The Little Paris Bookshop* by Nina George
3. non-fiction – *Crashing Through: The Extraordinary True Story of the Man Who Dared to See* by Robert Kurson

Between 7-11 people participate in each discussion. They usually meet the first Monday each month. The meetings last an hour and

a half to two hours. Participants take turns bringing a light refreshment. No attendance requirement – attend discussions that are of interest. The library purchases a copy of each selection that may be checked out by library patrons when the book is not reserved for the discussion. Copies of the books are made possible through inter-library loan and are available at the library.

The program is suitable for adults and open to Mont Vernon residents at no charge. For bookkeeping purposes, non-residents wanting to borrow a book will need to join the library, annual fee is \$15. New members are always welcome. Questions call the library at 673-7888.
