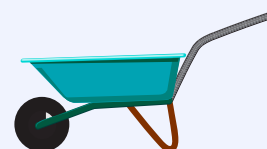
Library Garden Clean-Up

MONT VERNON HISTORICAL SOCIETY NEWS

Last time this YEAR: Museum to be OPEN October 8 from 1-4 p.m.

“Discover History Beneath Your Feet”

A chance to hunt for coins and other treasures with a metal detector

The Mont Vernon Historical Society Museum will be open for the last time this year on Saturday, October 8, from 1-4 p.m. It will reopen on Spring Gala Day in May 2017. The museum is located on the second floor of the Town Hall. It opened twenty-six years ago in 1990. There is no charge to visit the museum.

Customized House Plaques

Ask to see samples of the new customized house plaques that may be ordered for your home or given as a gift. They are suitable for old homes and new. You choose the wording. There are two shapes and three sizes available with the prices ranging from \$40-60. Order forms will be available at the museum on the 8th and may also be picked up at the Mont Vernon General Store, Daland Memorial Library, and Town Hall. Money raised will be used for ongoing preservation projects.

“Discover History Beneath Your Feet”

Wonder how a metal detector works? Historical Society Member and President of The Granite State Treasure Hunters Club for Historic Preservation, Michael Warren, will be on hand with other club members to show all interested how to use a metal detector while looking for coins and other metal objects buried outside around the Town Hall. Participants in the “Discover History Beneath Your Feet” interactive program may keep one item. There is no charge for this activity.

Exhibits

Exhibits at the museum include a collection on loan of metal found locally that is of interest including a 1773 coin that coincides with the year of the Boston Tea Party. Also on display is the recently restored 1858 map of Hillsboro County now back on the wall. See if you can find Mount Vernon as it was known at that time. The map had deteriorated over the years and was in need of attention. Thanks to the generosity of the Nipmugs chapter of The Questers in Amherst, and donations from individuals and the Mont Vernon Historical Society, the map looks almost as it once did.

Other exhibits of interest include the window and a bank of mail boxes from the post office that was located behind the general store from 1975-95. Also on display are Lamson Farm and Grand Hotel memorabilia, two quite rare antique Nutter clocks, and a row of eight David Dutton clocks recognized for their fine workmanship. It is believed his workshop was located where the War Monument now stands at the corner of Main St. and Grand Hill Rd. Look for the quilt made by the King's Daughters' organization that includes a square that is over 150 years old. One corner of the museum holds items of interest on the schools that have been in Mont Vernon over the years. The McCollom Building was the home for four different schools beginning with Appleton Academy (1852-1871) and ending with the Mont Village School (1947-1989). Some items and photos of the current Mont Vernon Village School are also included in this area. There is also a small library in the museum and a selection of historical society books, note cards, sweatshirts, and T-shirts for sale in the museum's store.

The museum closes for the winter as there is no heat. Both the Amherst and Milford historical society museums will be open at the same time on October 8th.

Consider supporting the museum by becoming a member. New members are always welcome. Annual dues are \$10; lifetime dues are \$100. (Dues to go up in May of 2017.) Morning Book Discussion Program

*New Members
Always Welcome!*

The next book in the Morning Book Discussion Program will be *A Century of November: A Novel* by W.D. Wetherell. The discussion will be held on Monday, November 7, at 10 a.m., at the library. The selection, published in 2002, is a haunting story of a Canadian judge who travels to see the grave of his son who died in Flanders as WWI was winding down. Once there he learns of the relationship his son had with a young woman before his death. The pain of death and the possibility of hope are themes. The book was the recipient of 2004 Michigan Literary Fiction Award. Copies of the book are now available at the library.

The dates and list of books for the rest of the year are as follows:

November 7 – fiction – *A Century of November: A Novel* by W.D. Wetherell

December 5 – non-fiction – *The Stories Behind the Best-loved Songs of Christmas* by Ace Collins

Alternatives in case a title is not available:

1. fiction – *A Man Called Ove* by Fredrik Backman
2. fiction – *The Little Paris Bookshop* by Nina George
3. non-fiction – *Crashing Through: The Extraordinary True Story of the Man Who Dared to See* by Robert Kurson



Between 7 and 11 people participate in each discussion. They usually meet the first Monday each month. The meetings last an hour and a half to two hours. Participants take turns bringing a light refreshment. No attendance requirement – attend discussions that are of interest. The library purchases a copy of each selection that may be checked out by library patrons when the book is not reserved for the discussion. Copies of the books are made possible through inter-library loan and are available at the library.

The program is suitable for adults and open to Mont Vernon residents at no charge. For bookkeeping purposes, non-residents wanting to borrow a book will need to join the library, annual fee is \$15. New members are always welcome. Questions call the library at 673-7888.

Librarian's Report:

We have a new staff member (Dana Laviano). She will be working on Wednesday evenings and Saturdays. Welcome Dana!

The Big Read kick-off was held at LaBelle Winery last Sunday and there was good representation from Mont Vernon. Over 100 people attended and the food ran out so the event was a big success! Please see the calendar for other Big Read events happening at participating libraries in the region. There are so many great things planned, including lectures, movies and even contra dancing!

September is library card month and the newly designed library cards (for new members going forward) are in! We purchased 250 and did not include the physical address of the library on the card which ensures the cards will still be useable if our dream of a new library is fulfilled.

Halloween: the candy collection boxes made by the Girl Scouts are at the library. One

will remain there and the other two will be positioned at the General Store and the Town Hall. Please start dropping off your candy! The library will be decorated with a spider theme for Halloween and the tents given by the FOTL will be in use again to create a spooky tunnel entrance to the library. The toys are expected to come in this week and we have three volunteers lined up for handing them out on the 31st. Thank you Sally, Alice and Shirley!

Election Day: There will be a Candy Bar Election going on in the library for kids to help them participate in and learn about the election process. Have them come in and meet the candidates (Reese's Peanut Butter Cup, Almond Joy, Kit Kat and Hershey) and cast their vote for their favorite.
