The Daland Memorial Library's Morning Book Discussion Program will meet on March 6 at 10:00am to discuss **The Bees** by Laline Paull. An interesting story with the main character being Flora, a bee, who is on the low end of the totem pole in bee society. Her strength and determination while trying hard to be loyal to the hive are admirable. When she challenges the Queen, there are consequences which lead to a suspenseful story.

Between seven and eleven people participate in each discussion. They usually meet the first Monday each month. The meetings last an hour and a half to two hours. Participants take turns bringing a light refreshment and may also volunteer to lead a discussion. No attendance requirement – attend discussions that are of interest. The library purchases a copy of each selection that may be checked out by library patrons when the book is not reserved for the discussion. Copies of the books are made possible through inter-library loan and are available at the library.

The program is suitable for adults and open to Mont Vernon residents at no charge. For bookkeeping purposes, non-residents wanting to borrow a book will need to join the library, annual fee is \$15. New members are always welcome. Questions call the library at 673-7888.

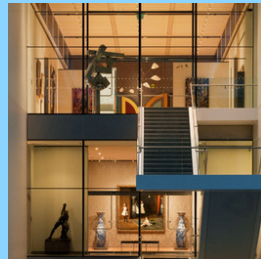
### Canterbury Shaker Museum - NEW

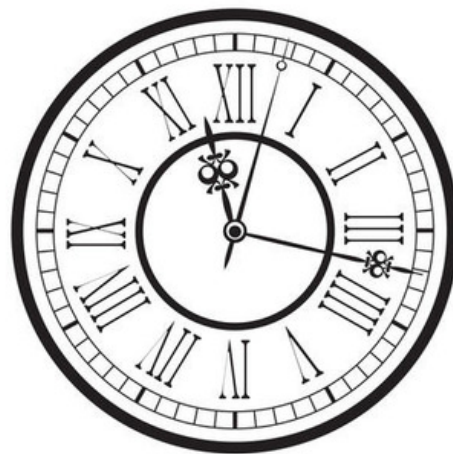
