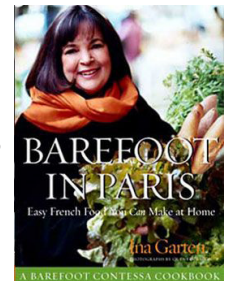

State of the Daland Memorial Library 2015

The NH State Library requires each library in NH to file an annual report. Here are some of the highlights from 2016.

- 12,763 people visited the library.
 - 19,590 materials were checked out.
 - 1,356 ebooks and audio books were borrow through NH Downloadable Book Consortium. Did you know they have 19,462 ebooks and 14,889 audio books that can be downloaded with your library card number for FREE?
 - 2,879 children attended 183 children's programs hosted by Miss JoAnn
 - The library has 14,028 print materials, 870 DVDs, and 312 audiobooks.
 - 202 children attended the Summer Reading Program.
 - Amy Wyman filled a record breaking 481 ILL (inter-library loan) requests for other libraries and borrowed a record high of 928 ILL loans for our patrons. AMAZING!

Mont Vernon Historical Society News

Plaque presentation, next meeting date, museum opening day

Mont Vernon Historical Society President Eloise Carleton presented a plaque to the Town Selectmen at Town Meeting on Wednesday, March 15. The plaque will be placed by the front door of the McCollom Building that started out as Appleton Academy (1852-1871). It went on to be the McCollom Institute (1871-1906), then the Stearns School (1906-1937). It was vacant from 1938-1947, then was the Mont Vernon Village School from 1947-1989. It has served as a municipal building since 1990.

Customized house plaques may be ordered for your home or given as a gift. They are suitable for old homes and new. You choose the wording. There are two shapes and three sizes available with the prices ranging from \$40-60. Order forms available at the Mont Vernon General Store, Daland Memorial Library, and Selectmen's Office in the Town Hall. Payments need to accompany each order. Money raised will be used for ongoing preservation projects.

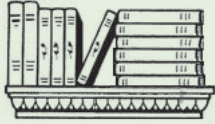

The Daland Memorial Library's Morning Book Discussion Program will meet on May 1, at 10 a.m. to discuss *Daughters of the Samurai: A Journey From East to West and Back* by Janice Nimura (NOTE, this replaces the original choice because of availability.) May's selection is based on the true story of three young Japanese girls sent to the US In 1871 by the Japanese government. Their mission is to spend ten years here before returning with the knowledge needed to educate the women of Japan in the ways of the modern world and in turn to help nurture a new generation of enlightened men to lead Japan. An intriguing story based on extensive research by the author. The book was well received when published in 2016.

Between seven and eleven people participate in each discussion. They usually meet the first Monday each month. The meetings last an hour and a half to two hours. Participants take turns bringing a light refreshment and may also volunteer to lead a discussion. No attendance requirement – attend discussions that are of interest. The library purchases a copy of each selection that may be checked out by library patrons when the book is not reserved for the discussion. Copies of the books are made possible through inter-library loan and are available at the library.

The program is suitable for adults and open to Mont Vernon residents at no charge. For bookkeeping purposes, non-residents wanting to borrow a book will need to join the library, annual fee is \$15. New members are always welcome. Questions call the library at 673-7888.

Friends of the Daland Memorial Library, Meeting Notes Monday, March 27, 2017

In attendance: Kristen Rodriguez, Jessica Hinckley, Larry Yetter, Bonnie Angulas, JoAnn Kitchel, Vanessa Chavez, and Mary Katherine McNamara.

Minutes: Bonnie Angulas proposed the following amendment to the February Meeting Minutes: Correct the FOTL Junque Jewels leader name to Alice Corbett. Larry Yetter made a motion to accept the minutes as amended, Jessica Hinckley second, all in favor.

Correspondence: JoAnn Kitchel received a letter addressed to the Library Trustees from longtime library patron and Mont Vernon resident, Charlene Hooper. Said letter was read aloud by JoAnn. In it, Charlene discussed her long standing history with the library as well as the accessibility issues posed by the Daland building, which currently prohibit her from utilizing the public facility. Charlene went on to express a sincere gratitude toward JoAnn as well as the rest of the library staff for ensuring that she can continue to enjoy reading borrowed books despite her inability to visit the library.

The FOTL discussed the challenges of not having an accessible library as well as the importance of ensuring all residents have access to the library. Discussion included potential solutions to improve library accessibility, such as by having FOTL volunteer to deliver books to residents who have accessibility constraints.

Librarian's Report

Bonnie Angulas announced that the beautiful paper dress crafted by the library staff made it into The Cabinet. She went on to discuss the well attended Meet the Candidate night, hosted

by the library. There was a total of 40 people who attended the event, which ran until 8:30 p.m. and lasted approximately one and a half hours. Bonnie discussed the value of having the library host these types of town events.

Warrant Article 11 was overwhelmingly passed at Town Meeting – congratulations library supporters! Library Trustees feel encouraged by this vote of support from the town. Should you feel so inclined, Friend expressed support for the construction of a new library will be invaluable.

NH State Library Report

Inter-library loan numbers increased significantly in 2016. This included approximately a three-fold increase in the number of books lent by the library within the inter-library loan program. Bonnie discussed proposed changes to this program by the Federal Government and the potential impact said changes would have on the ability of the library to effectively offer various programs. Should the inter-library loan program no longer operate, books clubs would no longer be able to be supported by the library as these programs depend on an influx of books borrowed from participating libraries. She encouraged the FOTL to stay informed on potential legislative changes which may affect this program.

JoAnn Kitchel will be attending a children's reading conference in Dover on Thursday, March 30th. Sign-ups are currently open for Spring Lap Sit and Story Time, which will begin in April. Larry Yetter has continued to be prompt in providing reimbursements for program expenses – thank you, Larry! The theme for the upcoming summer reading program is *Build a Better World*.

JoAnn is currently working on community outreach to encourage families with young children who are not already participating in Lap Sit and Story Time to sign up. Many of the current Story Time attendees will be starting kindergarten at the MVVS in the fall. Lap Sit is intended for birth to 3 year olds and Story time is geared at 3 to 5 year olds.

JoAnn is currently working on a grant application for the Amherst Garden Club. She would like to use the grant to create a children's garden behind the building. Award amounts vary.

Trustees Report

In the absence of Library Trustees, Bonnie Angulas discussed a potential survey to be conducted by the Library Trustees, which would seek to gauge the town's support of a new library and learn more about what the town wants in a new library.

Friends discussed the potential costs of the parade. Larry Yetter made a motion to provide \$100 for candy and any other supplies needed for the parade. Jessica Hinckley second, all in favor.

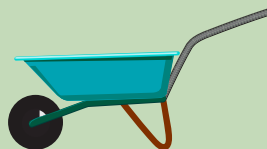

The more volunteers the quicker it will get done and look beautiful!

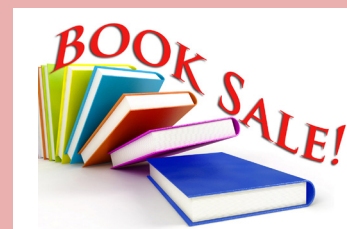


Volunteer Opportunities!
