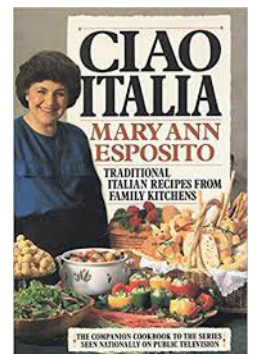

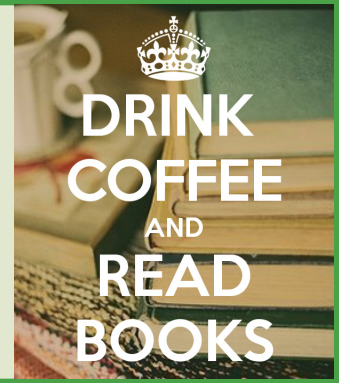

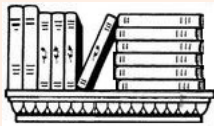

Treasurer's Report

Larry Yetter provided the following report:

NH Charitable Foundation Grant for the Summer Concert Series

The grant opened to accept applications on February 19th. Bonnie applied to receive \$4200 for the FOTL to sponsor a summer concert series on the town green. With the summer reading program being Library's Rock, this is a perfect opportunity for the library to apply for these funds, which favor libraries and music. Should the grant be awarded, the FOTL might need 2 volunteers to offer minimal support at the weekly event. There will be varying genres of music and the series would kick off on July 11th.

Town Meeting/Warrant Articles

Town Meeting will take place on Wednesday, March 14th in the Multipurpose Room at the Mont Vernon Village School. There are two warrant articles proposed for the library.

Warrant article 07 seeks a vote to authorize the withdrawal of \$45,000 from the Library Capital Reserve to fund engineering, architecture, and estimating services necessary to prepare a preliminary site plan for a new Library. No funds are to come from general taxation.

Warrant article 08 seeks a vote to appropriate \$105,000 for the purpose of purchasing the Daland building from the Daland Trust. The

building will continue to be maintained by the Daland Trust and used exclusively as the Town Library until such time as a new library building is approved, constructed, and occupied.

Your support for these warrant articles can be voiced in the form of letters to the editor of your favorite newspaper. Most importantly, we hope you'll attend Town Meeting to cast your votes!

The position of Secretary will need to be filled at the next FOTL meeting. Please consider stepping in to fill this vital role!
